Starkenburg Pilgrimage

The 26th annual Starkenburg Pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Sorrows in Starkenburg, Missouri was held from October 3-5. A record number of 500 pilgrims attended the three day pilgrimage. In addition to parishioners from St. Vincent de Paul, groups came from LaSalette (Georgetown, Illinois); St. Mary's boys and girls (St. Marys, Kansas); Assumption Academy boys and girls (Walton, Kentucky); Immaculate Heart of Mary (Minnesota); Our Lady of Good Success (Louisiana, Missouri); and St. Andrews Academy.

Over 1,000 pilgrims attended the one day pilgrimage on Saturday, October 5.

Temperatures were above normal for the time of year but everyone stayed very upbeat.



New Antependium

You will have noticed an antependium on the front of the altar on Sundays and major feast days.

An antependium was used on the altar in the past, which is liturgically correct, and the common Roman practice. During the liturgy (Mass, Vespers, etc.), the altar is vested like the priest, as it is a symbol of Christ. The altar as an image of Christ is found in the rite for the ordination of a subdeacon, who is given care over the altar and its linens. It is also something implicitly found in the consecration of the altar and church.

The liturgical authors all indicate that on consecrated altars, an antependium should be used, unless the altar is of such particular beauty already (through carvings, or perhaps the entombment of a saint within it), that such vestments would lessen the dignity of the altar.

St. Vincent's altar had remnants of the hardware for the old antependia, showing that these were used after the marble altar was installed in the late 1940s.

Dear Faithful,

In these days following the Christmas celebration, we naturally turn our gaze to the Holy Family, and consider what life must have been for Mary and Joseph, and the Divine Child.

Surely no family was ever so united, or so happy! It is good for us to reflect why, and to direct our lives accordingly. St. Joseph being the head, and thus taking the lead although he was less worthy than those for whom he was responsible, let us consider especially him.

We see firstly a readiness, on the part of Mary's spouse, to do whatever God might ask. Look at how, without question or hesitation, he obeys the bidding of the angel: taking Mary, mysteriously with child, as his wife... rising in the night, and fleeing from Herod into exile... returning to Nazareth after the evil king died. All was at the bidding of the angelic messenger of God, who spoke quietly in the darkness, asking at times the hard thing. "And Joseph did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him," says the Evangelist, and Mary with equal promptitude followed.

We see also, on the part of both Mary and Joseph, a profound spirit of trust. "Where God led, they did not know. It was enough to be led by God," writes Fr. Thieret. If God asked, God would provide. Much was at stake, the danger and uncertainties were great, and many times they did not see clearly the how or the why of what God requested of them. "They understood not the words that He spoke to them," says St. Luke. But if God asked, God would provide. Their hope was in Him, and they remained at peace, even in the darkest of hours. "We need never be afraid to abandon ourselves to God's will," says Fr. Boylan, "for God's will is God Himself – and God is infinite goodness."

Lastly, we see in Mary and Joseph an admirable spirit of faith, which allowed them to see God with them in the midst of their trials. Beyond the signs that accompanied the birth of the Savior, there was little that was remarkable in His early life. A child like any other, to all appearances... and yet, He was God. Mary and Joseph were not spared moments of great hardship and suffering – exile, poverty, danger – but these led neither to bitterness, nor even to sadness. The child they carried, by turn, in their arms, the child they held close to their heart, was Jesus. "To have Jesus with one in the struggles of life is the solution of life's problems," writes Fr. Leen. "If a man has to meet them alone, he is overcome by them. If he faces them in company with Jesus, he is formed, purified and perfected by them."

What an example we have in the Holy Family! Let us look to Mary and Joseph, and the Child, for the spirit that will assure the peace and unity and happiness of our own families.

New Antependium continued

One of the clips for the bar from which the cloth hangs was missing and we had no actual frontals to use. It seemed especially appropriate that once the main altar was consecrated, that at least on First Class feasts, it should be clothed appropriately.

Father Palko installed brass brackets and a small center hook to hold a steel rod from which the antependium can hang. The week before the consecration ceremony, he constructed the antependium using metallic fabric obtained from Greece (which matches one of our sets of gold

vestments), red brocade fabric, and metallic trim. The center gold work piece came from a vestment that was unable to be repaired.

Father has acquired additional fabric, and intends to make, or get help in making antependia of each liturgical color (white, red, green, violet, and black), and of different grades of quality to help make a distinction between greater feasts and lesser feasts, simply by visually looking at the altar. Fr. Palko is looking for volunteers to help with this project.

Angelus Press Conference
