# Priors' Corner

Newsletter – January/February 2025

Dear Friends,

“Give me leave to do my utmost.” This great cry from the heart of the artist, says Isak Dinesen (Karen Blixen) in her novelette, “Babette’s Feast,” goes through all the world. An artist would not do less than his best – he is compelled to give his all, to put his whole soul into his art; to do otherwise would be a torment.

“Give me leave to do my utmost!” We might say this is the great cry from the Heart of the Divine Artist of souls, Our Lord Jesus Christ. “Having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them unto the end.” (Jn. 13:1) Onto the end – to His very utmost. Our Lord’s one desire was to pour out His Blood to the last drop, in testimony of His love for His Father, and to win the hearts of men to love His Father as He, the Divine Son. He would give His all, nothing less would do, even though in strict justice the smallest offering would satisfy the justice of God.

Fr. Bede Jarrett explains:

The least action of our Blessed Lord would have been sufficient to have redeemed all mankind. He was God, and His least action was an action of infinite obedience and love of His Father. His suffering was not imposed on Him by divine justice, but it was deliberately chosen. He chose it, and so fulfilled the richest way of generosity. The justice of God would have been content with the least; that would satisfy it; the generosity of God would be content only with the most it could give: “Greater love than this no man hath, that he lay down his life.”

This is the spirit with which we want to enter the sacred season of Lent. We want our Lenten efforts to be motivated by a desire to give our all, to do our utmost. Because Our Lord has given, and gives, His utmost for us. He yet pours out His Divine Heart; His love remains what it was on Calvary:

On Calvary, God signed His book of love; He put His own initials of indefectibility upon the decision taken, signed with blood shed without a thought of return or regret. He signed it for Easter morning; He signed it for better or for worse. That is love.... For in all love there is valor: the valor, which is not afraid to cry, to offer, to carry, to endure. – Fr. de Chivré

Holy Mother Church in Lent encourages us to do penance, by which we make reparation for our sins, and fortify our soul against future falls. It is charity, our desire to love, that gives value to these efforts.

Let us ask Our Savior for a heart of valor: that we not be afraid to cry, to offer, to endure. Because that is love. And we, with Him, would “love unto the end.”

## *Song at the Scaffold*

The *Song at the Scaffold* was performed by the high school students at the H & R Block Theater at Union Station from February 21-23 and was directed by Miss Rebecca Heatwole.

The play is the story of the 16 Discalced Carmelite Martyrs of Compiègne, who offered their lives as a sacrifice to end the Reign of Terror in Revolutionary France. Tried in the “Courtroom of Freedom” on July 17, 1794, they were convicted as “fanatics” and went to the guillotine that same day. Ten days later,

the Terror ended with execution of Robespierre.

The martyrs were beautified by Pope St. Pius X in 1906, and declared saints by Pope Francis in 2024.
