Altar and Rosary Society Visit

Consecration Preparations

Work on the inside of the church continues in preparation for the Consecration on September 26.

Altars

A consecrated altar is a single, unbroken stone, which is engraved with five crosses, and into which a small cutout (called a sepulchre) is prepared to receive the relics of at least two canonized martyrs. There are two types of altars: a fixed altar (a large immovable stone structure), and a portable altar (also know as an altar stone, which can be place into a wooden structure and moved as needed).





When SSPX faithful acquired St. Vincent's the altars had lost their consecration (by the sale of the church). In order to provide a place to say Mass, a large section was carved out of each altar to fit a portable altar. In order to consecrate the altars at St. Vincent's as fixed altars, they required a sepulcher for the relics the bishop would enclose, and so while we had considered removing the altar stone and then covering this with a large piece, it was more appropriate to have Sarto Countertops (from St. Marys) produce new *mensæ* for the side altars with a proper sepulcher. Part of this decision was also because the tops of each altar did not match, and at some point, the Blessed Virgin Mary altar had been painted to look like wood, and



was unfitting to be used again without e x t e n s i v e rework.

S a r t o disassembled the altars and installed new

tops from a special grey limestone which they were able to get in a proper thickness. They were not able to obtain a large enough piece for the main altar, and so instead, designed a special stone to go in place of the portable altar which allows the relics to sit in the altar, and yet properly covers and fills in the hole that remains.

During the ceremony for the consecration of the altars, the bishop will take gold-plated copper boxes with the relics of St. Restituta, St. Fortunatus, and St. Vincent Liem de la Paz; three grains of incense; and a special certificate attesting to the relics authenticity and the consecration of the altar, and will seal these into the altar so that the whole top surface becomes a fixed consecrated altar. He will use a special cement made from Gregorian Water and plaster to seal these boxes into the altar.

Candle Sconces

Candle sconce, made by Will Watner in St. Marys, were installed under each of the wall crosses. The candles will burn from the Consecration itself until September 27 and on the anniversary of the Consecration of the church.


